Short Story in Hungarian Wins 2013 Rainbow Caterpillar Multilingual Kid Lit Award

Competition open to short stories for young children, aims to support the preservation in Canada of mother languages

Toronto, Ontario, June 24th, 2013 – Rainbow Caterpillar Bookshop is proud to announce that a short story in Hungarian is the winner of the 2013 Rainbow Caterpillar Multilingual Kid Lit Award. *When the Sun Dies*, by Csilla Istok, was selected from a short list of three finalists by a panel of language and industry experts.

“There were a number of excellent submissions this year, which made it necessary to go to two rounds of judging,” says Happie Testa, co-owner of Rainbow Caterpillar Bookshop, the sponsor of the Award. “By encouraging authors to write in their mother language, we want to help create a vibrant literary production for children in foreign languages, but with a uniquely Canadian perspective.”

The competition is open to unpublished short stories for children written in languages other than English by a Canadian resident. The winner will receive the Rainbow Caterpillar Multilingual Kid Lit Award in the amount of \$750. The finalists and other deserving submissions will also be recognized.

“We hope this award also encourages parents to pass their mother language on to their children raised in Canada,” says Hanoosh Abbasi, co-owner of Rainbow Caterpillar.

The Award, generously hosted and supported by the Canadian Ethnic Media Association (CEMA), was presented at the 35th CEMA Annual Awards Gala on June 21st.

The Award received submissions in eight languages. The stories received were reviewed by a panel of language experts which selected the finalists, the shortlisted stories were then reviewed by a panel of publishing industry experts tasked with selecting the winner.
